



Guidelines for Authors

The Reading Professor is a peer-reviewed publication forum for Professors of Reading Teacher Educators (PRTE), featuring topics, issues and events of interest to reading professors. The Editorial Board members welcome submission of papers from presentations related to PRTE program sessions, the International Reading Association and other reading and literacy forums. Authors are encouraged to submit articles or research studies directed toward the improvement of reading instruction at all educational levels. *The Reading Professor* also includes instructional practices, innovative strategies, course development and book reviews.

Requirements and Evaluation

- Author and co-author must be members of both the Special Interest Group Professors of Reading Teacher Educators and the International Reading Association
- Author should submit a cover letter that includes contact information of author(s), origin of the manuscript and a statement verifying the manuscript is not under consideration for publication by another journal at the time the article is submitted to *The Reading Professor*
- Author should submit 4 copies of the manuscript to the Editor (an electronic copy may also be requested)
- Manuscripts should be double-spaced (including references) and must follow the format of the *Publication Manual of the American Psychological Association (APA), (2009), 6th Edition*
- Manuscripts should be limited to approximately 20 pages in length (including references)
- Author's name and co-author's name, full address or addresses and date the manuscript is submitted should appear only on the cover page of the manuscript
- Avoid inclusion of the author's identity/sources in any portion of the manuscript in order to ensure an impartial review
- Manuscripts are evaluated by at least three reviewers (blind reviews)
- Manuscripts are evaluated in terms of significance of topic, timeliness, uniqueness, clarity of communication, overall organization, sentence structure, methodology (if appropriate), interpretation of information and aptness for this journal
- Decisions about publication are usually reached within two months
- Accepted manuscripts may be edited to promote clarity and improve organization
- Authors should refer to the Checklist for submitting manuscripts, *Publication Manual of the American Psychological Association, 6th Edition*, to avoid common oversights
